We have given the opportunities for residents to talk to us through a programme of Councillors surgeries In 2024, we will develop this further through a Communications, Engagement and Marketing Strategy















Hertford Town Council Plans for 2024/25

Environmental Sustainability

Over the last year we have:

- Declared a Climate Emergency
- Implemented sustainability criteria for stallholders at events
- Bee garden at Cromwell Road allotments has been re-astablished
- Continued work to reduce carbon footprint of the Council
- Agreed to ban use of pesticides/herbicides on Council land by April 2025
- Held an Eco Hub stall at our Dark Skies event

In 2024-25 we will:

- Develop an environmental sustainability strategy for the town from 2024 onwards
- Hold an Eco Fest for Hertford
- Continue to carry out work to our buildings to reduce energy use
- Plant more bee friendly plants in Town
 Centre planters
- Undertake a wildlife surveying day at Cromwell Road Allotments
- Carry out improvements to enhance the biodiversity of our Green Spaces

churchyards (totalling 11 acres)




